Stephen Wolfarth

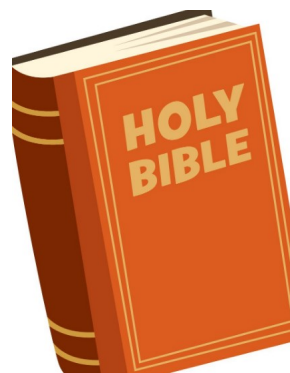
Graduating May 11th from Kent State with his Bachelor of Science in Nursing, with honors.

Small Steps

Part 1 is over. However, to those who participated we hope that the changes you have made in your health will continue! Watch for Small Steps 2 this summer!

Windows! (and we are not talking computers)

We are looking forward to opening them soon.

Fresh air is great but don't forget to follow window safety.

- Teach children to play in areas away from windows.
- Teach children and caregivers that screens keep bugs out, but they do not keep children in.
- This goes for adults too especially patio door screens.
- Keep windows closed and locked when not in use.
- Keep furniture or anything a child can climb on away from windows.
- For windows that are 6 feet or higher from the ground, install window stops or guards that limit windows to open less than 4 inches.
- Lessen the potential impact of injury from a fall out a window by using wood chips, grass or shrubs below.



Staying Safe with Power Washers!



Pressure washers are great at outside cleaning, but care needs to be taken when using. A pressure washer's intense spray can cause wounds and other serious injuries that may first look to be very minor. This can cause an injured person to delay getting treatment which can increase the risk for infections and even amputation.

- Number one safety tip is to never point it at a person.
- Make sure the ground fault circuit interrupter is working before using
- To prevent carbon monoxide poisoning don't use a gas-powered device inside a closed unventilated area.
- Try not to use an extension cord. Keep the washer's power cord connection out of standing water. Use a cord rated for use in wet environments.
- Wear rubber soled shoes.

If you are injured:

- Wash hands /area with soap and water
- Place a pressure dressing on the wound with a clean cloth or towel to stop bleeding
- When bleeding has stopped run clear water over the wound
- Place clean dry adhesive bandage on wound
- Go to the Emergency Center immediately.

Spring is also bringing TICKS!!!!



Ticks can carry a bacteria that leads to Lyme Disease. Not all ticks carry the bacteria. Ticks are so small, and you may not know that you were bitten so it is important to do all you can to prevent.

Prevention:

Be aware of ticks in high-risk areas like shady, moist ground cover on areas with tall grass, brush, shrubs and low hanging trees.

Wear closed toe shoes or boots, long sleeved shirts, and long pants. Tuck pant legs into shoes or boots to prevent ticks from crawling up legs.

Use an insect repellent containing 10 -30% Deet

Wear light colored clothing, so it is easier to see ticks

Keep long hair pulled back or tucked into hat for protection

Don't sit on ground outside

Check for ticks regularly. Wash clothes and hair after being outside.

Don't forget to check your dogs after they have been outside especially in high risk areas.

What if I find a tick?

Use tweezers to grasp the tick firmly at its head or mouth – the part closest to skin. Pull firmly and steadily until it lets go of the skin. If a small part remains in the skin, it will eventually fall out. If it does not come out or you have signs of irritation or symptoms of Lyme disease call your MD. Swab the area with alcohol. Put the tick in a sealed container. Call your MD as he may also want to see the tick.

Don't use "folk remedies" like petroleum jelly or trying to light a match to kill it as it may cause it to bury deeper.

For symptoms of Lyme Disease check out the EDU -board in Fellowship Hall this Sunday !
